



Plants grow best with really good soil and just the right amount of water and sun. Just like plants, we start from small and grow from there. 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MINI GREENHOUSE

WHAT YOU NEED:

an adult's help, spoon or small trowel, gardening gloves, two clear plastic crps, potting mix seeds (I used alfalfa sprouts), craft stick, felt-tipped pen, spray bottle of water

DIRECTIONS:

Put on your gardening gloves and using the spoon or small trowel, fill the cup almost to the top with potting mix and gently tap it down to so it's not loose.
Place seeds on the top of the soil.

• Carefully cover the seeds with more soil and gently pat it down.

• Using the spray bottle, water the seeds well.

• Write the plant's name on the craft stick and push it into the cup (making sure you don't disturb the seeds).

• With an adult's help, trim the top of the other cup so that it's smaller than the cup with the seeds. Place it over the seeds and

gently press it into the soil until it is secure. Put your mini greenhouse on a windowsill and watch your seeds grow. Awesome!

How it works!

Your mini greenhouse is selfwatering. The water sprayed on the seeds will evaporate and turn into water vapour as the greenhouse gets warmer. When the vapour rises to the top of the greenhouse it cools down and condenses back into water – that's the drops of water you see running down the sides of the cup. That waters the seeds to help them grow.

Just like a seed needs soil, sun and water to grow roots and thrive, we need some things to help us grow in our faith – like reading the Bible and praying (talking) to God. "Plant your roots in Jesus and let him be the foundation for your life," (Colossians chapter two, verse seven).


